## **Ridgewater Foundation receives \$37,000 Kandiyohi COVID relief grant for students**

WILLMAR and HUTCHINSON, MN – If this year’s pandemic has left you unemployed, furloughed or working for reduced wages or hours and you’re interested in furthering your education or training, a new Coronavirus Pandemic Relief (CPR) grant awarded to the Ridgewater College Foundation might be the sign of hope you’ve been waiting for.

Thanks to federal CARES Act funding made available to nonprofits by the Kandiyohi County and City of Willmar Economic Development Corporation, the Ridgewater College Foundation has \$37,000 in scholarship funds for eligible students, to be awarded in amounts ranging from \$1000 to \$2000 per student.

“The CPR funds are providing critical assistance to businesses and nonprofit organizations to get through this rough economic patch,” said Aaron Backman, Executive Director for Kandiyohi County and the City of Willmar EDC. Thus far, the EDC has received more than 260 applications for assistance. Backman said he anticipates being able to fund about 90% of their applications with available funds.

“Ridgewater College and the Foundation are excellent, local partners for meeting workforce training needs stemming from COVID-19 impacts,” Backman said. “Scholarships like this can have a broad reach in impacting our region.”

These new Kandiyohi COVID Kickstart Scholarships will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis, with a final award and registration deadline of December 5 quickly approaching. The scholarships are unique in that they can be used for not only credit courses, but also short-term Customized Training and Continuing Education courses and programs.

Student eligibility criteria include:

- Must be a Kandiyohi County resident or be employed (or formerly employed if laid off) by a Kandiyohi County business
- Must demonstrate loss of job/income due to COVID-19
- Must register by December 5 for Ridgewater credit course (s) for spring 2021 OR for a Customized Training/Continuing Education training during November, December or January.

“We are pleased and proud to partner with the EDC to support our community and provide this support to individuals interested in furthering their education and expanding their workforce skills during this difficult time,” said Kelly Magnuson, Ridgewater Vice President of Advancement and Outreach/Foundation Executive Director. “It’s a wonderful opportunity for those impacted negatively by COVID to consider training and education that might not otherwise be possible.”

Magnuson said she anticipates the demand for Kickstart Scholarships to be high, and expects the funding to benefit approximately 20-37 individuals seeking education and training at Ridgewater in the coming months. Awardees will be notified within approximately 10 days of their application.
